

DALMALLY GOLF CLUB: GUIDANCE FOR GOLFERS: FROM 5th JANUARY 2021

Designed to allow safe and enjoyable golf at Dalmally, we ask all members, their guests and visitors to observe the following guidelines and to comply with the latest Scottish Government guidance.

Please stay at home

- If you are ill or have any symptoms of COVID-19.

Golfers who are 'shielding'

- Please follow the Scottish Government guidance

Before playing

- The clubhouse is closed and toilet facilities are not available
- Bring your own hand sanitiser to the course – as well as any drink and food you may require
- Please do **not just turn up and play**.
- Book a tee-time by e mailing dalmallygolfclub@outlook.com. or by phoning/texting 07717 150691. Provide a contact phone number and say when you wish to play and with whom. If you are a visitor, you will receive information on how to make payments. Your details will be held confidentially under our privacy policy and will be destroyed after 21 days.
- Tee-times will be at 10-minute intervals
- You can play as a group of up to two golfers from up to two households and always subject to the physical distancing rules
- As the clubhouse is closed, bring plenty of balls, tees etc. Do not share or exchange equipment with other players unless members of your household.
- Aim to arrive at the Club no more than 15 minutes prior to playing.
- Park your car to allow physical distancing.
- Change your shoes in the car park.

On the course

- Please do not go to the first tee more than five minutes before your tee-time
- Always follow the physical distancing rules on the course
- Use your hand sanitiser frequently during your round.
- There are no rakes at the bunkers, and you are asked to do your best to smooth the sand with your club and/or your foot
- If there are players ahead on the next tee, do not approach the tee until they have played their drive and moved away from the tee
- Do not touch the flags and pins. We have fitted stoppers on the pins. This will allow the ball to drop into the hole but with enough of its surface above the ground to let you lift your ball without touching any surfaces. But, remember, you do not have to sink your putt in casual golf.
- Do not share equipment, food or drink with others, unless from your household.
- Avoid touching handrails and other permanent fixtures.

After your round

- Return right away to your car, change your shoes and put your equipment in your car
